The band switch from melodic nu-disco to grooves that recall Krautrock influences and 60s psychedelia, but they always stay focussed on getting you onto the dancefloor. Beware the Ratbot! Mega popular indie heroes, Gambling Hearts make a welcome return to their hometown to appear at this year's event and the evening gets underway with a debut from electro pop/rockers, Body by Design, think Depeche Mode, Gary Numan and Nine Inch Nails and you won't be far off the mark

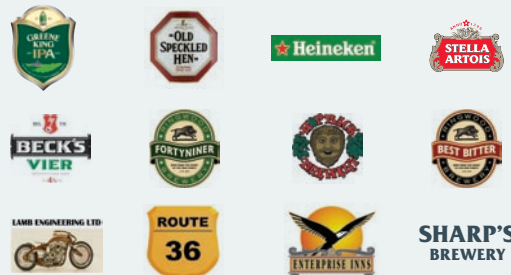
